At the heart of these learning experiences is new-found understanding and appreciation for their strength, competence and creativity.

A fierce, fun-loving atmosphere encompasses our program as campers explore the fullness of their identity, redefine failure, and build on success. Every day there are new activities to challenge our campers as they engage with the natural world and push through physical boundaries. These intrepid youth depart F&W with lasting friendships, a deeper self-awareness, and a new resolve to embrace themselves as they are.

The interplay that will happen between Work Projects and our Trips Program will model and allow campers to engage in one type of the **interdependence** we so value at F&W. We contribute to the running or creation of something, and in turn, benefit ourselves.

The act of building such a large-scale project will allow many to practice the type of skills acquisition F&W is known for, and FS in particular, for girls and nonbinary youth, thereby developing an important type of **agency**. Finally, the high visibility this project will no doubt have, and the way it will be embedded in two of our core activity areas – Work Projects and Trips – will help campers consider their own relationship with these aspects of our program, further supporting elements of their own **identity** development.



The Expansion




New Construction Layout
